HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION

DUTIES OF THE COMMISSION:

Serve as a resource to the community on access and referrals to public services, including, but not limited to:

- Refer all potential discrimination claims to the State of Minnesota for investigations and adjudication.
- Develop online resources to meet the needs of citizens seeking information or assistance regarding emergency food, shelter, financial assistance, medical referrals, etc.
- Refer residents to the proper city departments, commissions, or boards as needs arise.

- Provide ESL language resource documents such as emergency services or, supportive material as needed
- Maintain up to date voter information within the Resource Document including links for voter registration locally
- The Human Rights Commission respects the privacy of all residents. Any correspondence is held confidential unless requested by sender for referral.
- Work as a consultation – advisory body for the City Council to create new resources, solve concerns and make referrals or suggestions.
- Provide a comprehensive Annual Report to the city Council

CITY OF ANOKA, HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION MEETINGS:

The Commission meets on a bi-monthly basis or as needed basis at City Hall. Meetings are publically posted on the City website. The public is invited to attend these meetings.
