The Anoka Police Department is legally required to ensure public safety for all people. In limited circumstances, this responsibility may involve assisting with traffic control to maintain safety during federal operations. Our officers' role in these situations is focused on de-escalation, public safety, and maintaining order, not enforcing immigration law.

The Anoka Police Department



- Is dedicated to serving the Anoka community with professionalism, dignity, and respect, ensuring public safety while upholding the trust of all residents.
- Enforces state and local laws only.
- Will maintain open lines of communication with local, state, and federal law enforcement partners.

Anoka Police Do NOT:

- Ask people about immigration status
- Have the legal authority to enforce civil immigration laws.
- Arrest or detain people because of their immigration status.
- Conceal their identity.



Anoka Police WILL:

- ✓ Be in uniform or have clear APD markings visible (ex. squad car, vest, jacket) when on patrol.
- ✓ Respond if you have concerns about the legitimacy of any law enforcement officers or suspicious people.

Laws Surrounding Anoka Police & Federal Law Enforcement Agencies

- Anoka Police cannot impede or interfere with federal agents.
- Anoka Police do not have the ability to confirm the validity of a federal search or arrest warrant.
- Federal law prohibits Anoka Police officers from obstructing or interfering with the work of federal officers while they are performing their official duties (18 U.S.C. 1501).
